SUMMARY

This report provides an overview of the Secretariat's operations during the first half of the 2026 financial year following the approach decided by the Sixth Session of the Meeting of the Parties.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Advisory Committee take note of the outcomes achieved by the Secretariat since MoP8 and, if appropriate, use this information to suggest amendments to the Secretariat's Work Programme (**AC15 Doc 15**).

1. INTRODUCTION

In accordance with the decisions taken by the Sixth Meeting of the Parties (MoP6), the Secretariat prepares two financial reports per year, one in February covering the first six months of the financial year, and a full-year audited report in September. MoP6 decided that the most recent such report would be presented to the relevant session of the Advisory Committee or Meeting of the Parties.

During the six-month period (1 July 2025 to 31 December 2025) ACAP was represented at several meetings of Regional Fisheries Management and Conservation Organisations (RFMCOs) and other international bodies. Over the six months the Secretariat continued to implement actions in the Advisory Committee and Secretariat Work Programmes. Preparations for AC15 got underway.

2. SECRETARIAT HEADQUARTERS

The Secretariat's office remains at Level 2, 119 Macquarie Street, Hobart, Tasmania.

3. STAFFING

Staffing of the Secretariat remains at two full-time positions, the Executive Secretary and the Science Officer. Additional support to the Secretariat is provided by volunteers, consultancies and internships, as well as by Advisory Committee officials. John Cooper continued to contribute to some communications activities, as Emeritus Information Officer.

4. CONTRACTS/CONSULTANTS

2M Language Services continued to provide translation and interpretations services.

Web developers *Preflight* continued to host and administer the ACAP website.

Diviv Group Pty Ltd continued to provide database development services.

Sebastián Jiménez attended RFMCO meetings as an ACAP representative on a contractual basis.

5. SUPPORT TO THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Secretariat liaised closely with Advisory Committee officials and members throughout the six-month period. The assessment process for the Small Grants Round launched in September 2024 was completed in November 2025, with applicants advised of the outcome of their request for funding in December 2025. Grants will be awarded to successful applicants in early 2026.

7. OTHER INTERNATIONAL ENGAGEMENT

Attendance at the meetings outlined above provided opportunities for interaction in the margins with a range of delegations. In addition, the Executive Secretary made liaison visits to South Africa and Namibia. While in Cape Town, South Africa, the Executive Secretary met with ACAP's National Contact Point, and the representatives for the Meeting of the Parties and Advisory Committee, as well as the Emeritus Information Officer. While in Namibia to review potential venues for AC15, the Executive Secretary met with Graça D'Almeida and other officials in the Namibian Government in Windhoek, and Lizette Voges, Executive Secretary of the SEAFO Secretariat in Swakopmund.

MoP8 had asked the Secretariat to develop and conclude a Memorandum of Understanding with Global Fishing Watch (GFW). Productive exchanges have occurred between ACAP and GFW on the content of the MoU, including in the margins of the 22nd WCPFC Commission meeting in Manila.

8. RENEWAL OF ARRANGEMENTS WITH OTHER INSTITUTIONS

During the six-month period, the Secretariat commenced work on renewal of the Letter of Intent with the IOTC, which is due to expire in February 2026. Following consultations with the IOTC Secretariat we were advised that any future arrangement concerning the IOTC will now need to be negotiated directly with the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO). This work is underway, and approval will be sought from Parties to agree to the content of the proposed arrangement with the FAO (on behalf of IOTC) when developed.
